

## Pairs

This is a game for 2 to 4 players. You will need:

• a pack of playing cards.

Remove the coloured cards (King, Queen, Jack), Jokers, 10 cards and any card game rules which may have been included in your pack of cards. You will need only the Ace to 9 cards. Ace has a value of 1 in this activity. Shuffle the cards well and then place face up on the floor or table.


## Pairs

How to play:

On an agreed signal, the players try to pair as many of the cards as they can into pairs that make total 10.

At the end of the game, there should be no left over cards.

The player with the most pairs of 10 wins that round.

Remove the 9 cards.

On an agreed signal, the players try to pair as many of the cards as they can into pairs that make total 9.

Pairs that make 9 are harder, so the children will be slightly slower at this task, even though there are less cards.

The player with the most pairs wins that round.
